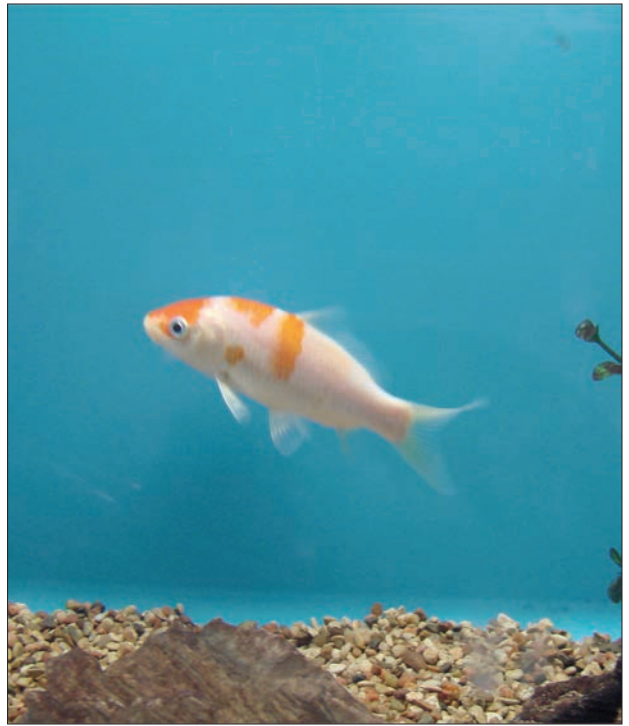

Puppies are young dogs.

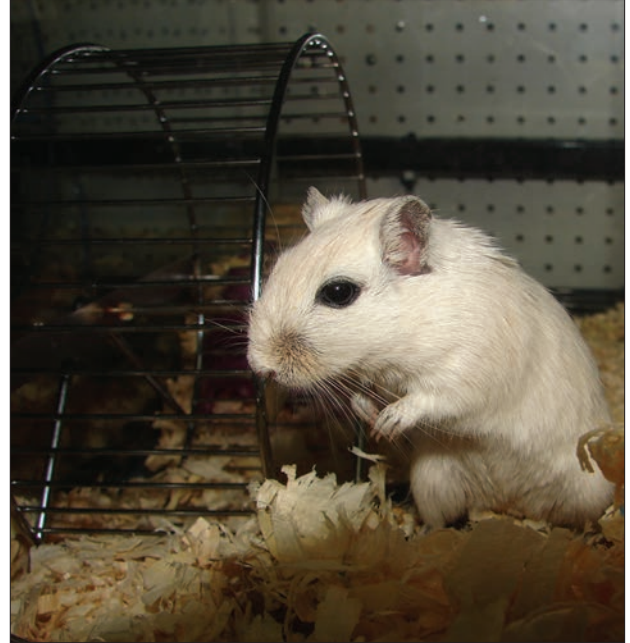
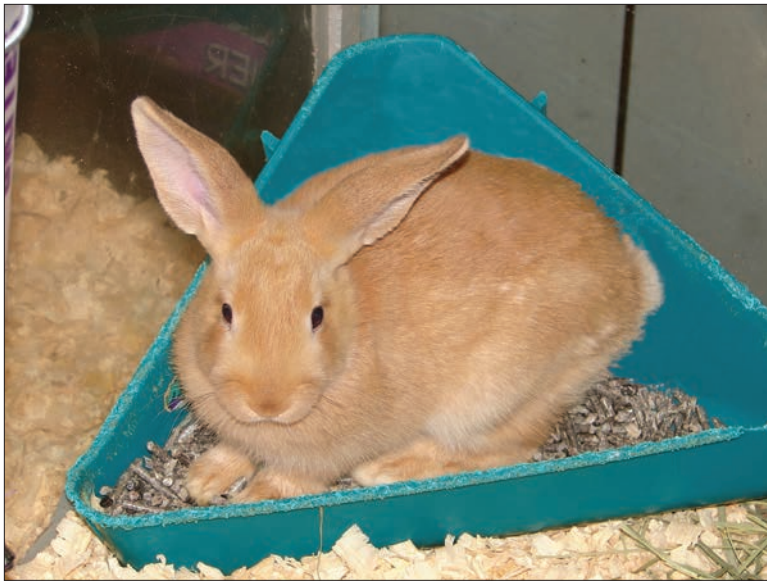


Pets grow up to look like their parents.

All pets need food, water, and air to live.



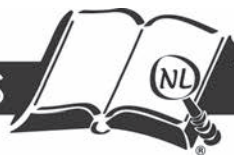
